LIGHT

I pray that you and your family are safe from the COVID-19 pandemic. If you remember in the October WalkTalk, I told you that my wife, Paula, was diagnosed with breast cancer. She had her lumpectomy and 15 radiation treatments before Christmas. The worst part was actually after the radiation stopped because of the cumulative effect of the radiation. She is on estrogen blocker drugs for five years to reduce the likelihood of the cancer coming back. She still has fluid in the area where the tissue was removed. If you remember in October, I told you we were confident that God would get her through the lumpectomy and radiation treatment. It was not easy and there was a lot of pain. Paula just had her checkup, and she doing great except for the fluid not going away and her being tired easily. We are very thankful for your prayers and God's providence. Praise God!

I tell you all this because, I have believed for a long time that we go through things in our lives that are about strengthening our faith and learning to trust God. Paula and I have grown the most in our faith when we had the problems, issues, or bad times. Also, I believe sometimes it is more than about us. We go through things so that we can understand the issues and can have compassion for others going through what we went through. We can have a bond with others because they know that we went through the same problems, issues, or bad times and came out OK on the other side. We can be their "on earth" comforters to show them love or the LIGHT that God gives us. Since Paula's breast cancer treatment, she has been a LIGHT comforter to three friends through Emmaus in Houston and one friend here in Austin who have been diagnosed with breast cancer after Paula.

If we are totally honest with each other, NO ONE goes through life unscathed by problems or bad times. Sometimes when we are in the thick of the issue or bad time, we think we are the only one that has problems or bad times. We can list people that we know that seem to not have any issues or bad times but that is not true. We just do not see their issues or bad times! Without Bad times we really cannot appreciate the Good times! God's LIGHT on the stars cannot shine without darkness! We can handle far more things than we think we can with God's help to give us strength. We need to remember to continue to spread God's LIGHT by sharing our love with those that are in bad times. We can still show his LIGHT or love whether we went through that issue or not!

The bible has a lot to say about LIGHT in the world:

John 8:12 - Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the LIGHT of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the LIGHT of life."

John 1:5 - The LIGHT shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

Ephesians 5:8 - For at one time you were darkness, but now you are LIGHT in the Lord. Walk as children of LIGHT.

Matthew 5:14 - "You are the LIGHT of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden.

Psalm 27:1 - Of David. The Lord is my LIGHT and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?

Psalm 119:105 - Your word is a lamp to my feet and a LIGHT to my path.

Talking to Just Me

I am Covid weary. I am zoomed out. That makes me pretty normal right now as many of us have found the past year....er, uh,...perhaps "trying" is the word. But, you know what? I have been weary before. Life has it's ups and downs. I am reminded of another time in my life I was weary. My life had been turned upside down and my normal supports seemed to have disappeared and to say I was not feeling like a very successful person was an understatement. I had a plane reservation to take myself to Colorado for a vacation because mountains feed my soul. But God had other plans.

God told me to cancel the plane reservation and go on an Emmaus Walk that was happening. No, I don't hear voices. I can't explain how God told me that but it was very clear that I was supposed to go on that Walk. I knew all about Emmaus...or at least I thought I did. I had been being invited to Walks for thirteen years. I had friends and clients who had been and I had heard many snippets and stories that most people don't hear about Walks. After all, you can tell your therapist anything because the therapist has to keep what you say confidential.

So off I went knowing what would happen. Boy was I wrong. On the way when we stopped for dinner, the restaurant lost our order and by the time they figured that out and got food to us it was nearly time to be at the Walk. No problem. I knew from all the stories I had heard that they feed you 24 hours a day so, even though I am hypoglycemic and need to eat regularly, I hurriedly gulped down a bite or two and left the restaurant knowing I would soon be fed again. Okay, so Thursday night was not my favorite night of the Walk.

I lived until Friday morning. I got up and got dressed with NO help from Sandy Cheatham Moranto who had managed to pick up my brush with her stuff while I was washing my hair and unknowingly put it in her suitcase. Friday morning, wet hair, no brush., how do you ask for help on Friday morning???? What an adventure. Oh well, I was about to get breakfast and caffeine. But no, they told me to go to chapel. What??? Send someone who is hypoglycemic to chapel with no food or caffeine??? I cannot be spiritual when my blood sugar is low and my hair is a mess! What kind of torture would they think of next??? This was not in the stories I had been told.

Friday got better after breakfast and it became more of what I knew would happen at the Walk. But then Saturday hit! No story could have prepared me for Saturday's experience. You know how sometimes it seems a speaker is talking to just you? Well, it seemed a speaker was talking to just me. It literally took my breath away. It pierced my hurting heart and God did a mighty healing work in me. The quote "Life is not measured by the number of breaths we take, but by the moments that take our breath away" became very real and personal in my life that day.

God knew the Emmaus Community was just what I needed at that point in my life. I began helping with Walks and enjoying the gatherings. Then I joined the Board and eventually was Lay Director for a Walk. One very big piece of Covid weary has been missing the gatherings. I miss the hugs. I miss the music. I miss the 4th day talks. I miss seeing people whose lives only cross mine at gatherings. I miss the energy of all that in person talking during dinner.

But, if there is anything I learned at my Walk, it is that God's timing is perfect. What was said in that talk that pierced my heart would not have been said at any previous Walk. Had I made it anytime in the previous thirteen years, the Walk would not have had the same impact on me. So, I choose to believe that God has lessons in this time of Covid. I choose to do what I have been having clients do. I choose to look at the gifts of Covid. Yes, you heard me correctly....the gifts of Covid. I choose to see God's provision during this time. I choose to say thank you for those good things that have and are happening during this time. I choose to believe that I will appreciate those in person gatherings in a renewed way when we finally get to break bread together and hug again. I choose to treasure the technology enabled contacts I have had with some Emmaus friends during this time.

As I write this I hear birds singing. When I look outside I see signs of spring even so quickly following the Texas Snowpocalypse. God is at still at work and can even use Zoom and other technology to keep us going until we can meet in person again.

The March Board Meeting was held by Google Meet due to the current pandemic restrictions on mass gatherings to prevent the spread of the Covid-19 pandemic.

The meeting was called to order at3:21pm and Nelda Carpenter opened the meeting in prayer.

QUORUM: Nine Board members were present providing a quorum for the meeting.

MINUTES: The Board of Directors Meeting Minutes were sent by email for the previous meeting held on January 9, 2021 and were approved by email.

REPORTS - The following officers, directors, or other persons presented reports to the Board of Directors, with any items discussed or actions taken as noted below. The following items were discussed:

<u>LAY DIRECTOR'S REPORT</u> – Steven Scott reported that Patti Bizzell has resigned from the Board of Directors but will continue to serve as a temporary back-up for Rick Seifert, who has agreed to move into the Treasurer position. The Board wants to thank Patti for her many years of service to the Greater Austin Emmaus Community.

We will need to find a permanent back-up for Treasurer and we will also need a new member to serve as Database/Website Support.

Due to our limited meeting and Gathering abilities and no Walks over the past year, Steven Scott asked the Board members to consider serving an additional year on the Board. Fred, Dennis and Steven have agreed to extend their roles for another year for the benefit of the GAEC community as Past Lay Director, Assistant Lay Director and Lay Director.

Steven hopes to send out the final Board job descriptions before the next Board meeting.

Fred will sign and send out the letter to the Upper Room reporting the finalization of the Eagles Wings Merger.

Due to the on-going Covid restrictions Steven made a motion to cancel the planned Walk for June 10-13. Mel seconded the motion. The motion passed. At this time, we are still scheduled for future Walk dates of November 4-7, 2021.

Steven recommended we cancel the April Board meeting. Jeanne Randall made a motion there not be a Board meeting in April and George seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Mailchimp was sent out requesting Reunion Group info on times, locations, contact info and online info from the community to be able to update the website.

<u>TREASURER'S REPORT</u> – Rick Seifert submitted the Treasurer's report by email. His report indicated the Frost Bank balance reconciled with the Aplos balance of \$32,857.21. The report was approved by email.

How Much Do You Like the Word—TEST?

Well if you're like me, not very well. I study hard before the TEST to know the correct answers and get a good grade. TESTS are not much fun when the topic is not very interesting, and when TESTS seem to be presented with many complications, or did I answer them all? But something to remember is that TESTS are also part of our lives. Something we all live with like it or not.

In my years as an adult being TESTED is part of life. Some TESTS require answering questions, while others are evaluating a situation and what is the best solution for me or sometimes for others too. One TEST we all have recently gone through is a Pandemic called COVID-19. All of our personal lives have changed. We have seen many changes in some while others have not.

My church's Wednesday morning Bible Study based on the book "FIRE ON THE MOUNTAIN" by Ray Vander Laan covered the Hebrews Exodus story. In reading the scriptures in Exodus we read about:

Moses birth, as an adult Moses ran away to Midian after killing an Egyptian who beat a Hebrew slave, the burning bush, the plagues put on the Egyptians to let His people go, crossing the Red Sea and entering the desert for 40 years. In these 40 years there were TESTS placed on Moses by the Hebrew people. TESTS I ike where is the water we need? Where is the food we need? Where is our God? So the Hebrew's built a Golden Calf to worship when Moses went up the mountain for the 10 Commandments. Finally being in the desert and seeing Moses' death, and never crossing the Jordan River.

While studying Ray Vander Laan's book and the Old Testament book of Exodus an unwanted issue arrived. I had back surgery in April. Then I fell and broke my left hip requiring a complete replacement in June. During this time I eventually came to the realization that God was TESTING me in my situation as I sat feeling sorry for myself. I started to read "Our Daily Bread" the daily devotional. The more I read, the more I realized the importance of relying more on God's loving mercy towards me and the assurance of my trusting faith in Jesus. On March 1st I read that day's devotional titled, "Never Give Up." I now have lived the TEST and realize that I receive a never ending LOVE from God, and that I can give this Love to others.
